## ECTS CREDIT TRANSFER SYSTEM

ECTS is based on the principle that 60 credits measure the workload of a full-time student during one academic year (30 credits per semester). The student workload of a full-time study programme in Europe amounts in most cases to around 1500-1800 hours per year and in those cases one credit stands for around 25 to 30 working hours.

ECTS credits are allocated to all educational components of a study programme

(such as modules, courses, placements, dissertation work, etc.) and reflect the quantity of work each component requires to achieve its specific objectives or learning outcomes in relation to the total quantity of work necessary to complete a full year of study successfully.

The performance of the student is documented by a local/national grade. The ECTS grading scale ranks the students on a statistical basis. Grades are assigned among students with a pass grade as follows:

A best 10%

B next 25%

C next 30%

D next 25%

E next 10%

\*A distinction is made between the grades FX and F that are used for unsuccessful students. FX means: “fail- some more work required to pass” and F means: “fail – considerable further work required”.

An overall score of 10/20 is required to validate the total number of credits attributed to the modules selected on the Learning Agreement.
